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Watertown Fire Rescue PAD Program

Did you know if you were in sudden cardiac arrest and you do not receive defibrillation before five minutes, you will probably die. The PAD program or AED's save lives and is safe, simple, and easy to use.

General Information

Watertown Fire Rescue and Prairie Lakes Hospital have joined together to sponsor a Public Access Defibrillators (PAD) program. Each PAD may be purchased through Watertown fire Rescue at a cost of \$1,640 (normal price being \$2,400.) If a business is unable to afford the \$1,640 fee, said organization may apply for a \$500 matching grant for each PAD requested. Funding will be directed to businesses, agencies, and groups that can substantiate need. Each location will sign a waiver of liability releasing the Watertown Fire Rescue, Watertown Community Foundation, and Prairie Lakes Hospital from liability should there be any claims made as a result of placement or use of a PAD.

Qualifying Criteria

- The placement must be a geographic location so the EMS response time must be within 15 minutes.
- The site location of the Personal Access Defibrillator must be within three minutes of any possible sudden cardiac arrest event.
- There must be easy access to the PAD.
- There must be volunteers/staff willing to be trained on the use of the PAD and show a willingness to respond to an event.
- There must be ongoing maintenance to the PAD.
- The population served must be defined as high-risk. For example, a high-risk site would have a population of people age 50 or older. Other risk factors could be family history of heart disease, diabetes, or some other risk factor.
- The volume or number of visitors/employees and amount of high-risk activity at a location will also be considered. Sites with a population over 25 will be weighed more heavily.
- Watertown Fire Rescue must register said organization with the state health department.

Applications

Applications may be mailed or hand-delivered to Watertown Fire Rescue Attn: Jake Jorgenson. All applications must be clearly legible. Poor quality copies or missing information may result in your application being eliminated from consideration. Written notification of award will be sent to agencies.
